
## Superintendent's Message






Our annual 5th Grade Graduation was held the evening of May 19. We look forward to watching the achievements of these 46 students as they advance to middle school and beyond.

The Carpenter's Cupboard Food Pantry, Strasburg's Community Food Pantry housed in the Strasburg United Methodist Church, is open for food distribution the **third Thursday** of every month from 9:00-11:30 a. m. and 5:30-7:30 p.m. Eligibility to shop is based on the income guidelines for the Federal and State Funded Food Programs and are as follows:

#### HOUSEHOLD ELEIGIBILITY GUIDELINES
